- Measure one object (e.g., length of a table or diameter of a plate) using a ruler and write the measurements.

Fraction Feast

- Help in the kitchen and observe a food item (e.g., a pizza, chapati, or cake) being divided.
- Write how it was divided (e.g., into 4 equal parts) and express it as a fraction (e.g., 1/4).
- Draw the food item, show how it was divided, and write 2-3 sentences about the fractions you saw.

Time Tracker

- For one day, keep track of how much time you spend on 3 activities (e.g., watching TV, playing, or studying).
- Note the start and end times, then calculate the duration for each activity in hours and minutes.
- Show your calculations and write which activity took the most/least time.

Market Math

- Visit a local market or shop with your family (or use a grocery list at home).
- Note the prices of 5 items and calculate their total cost.
- If you had ₹200, how much change would you get? Show your calculations and write 2-3 sentences about your experience.

Pattern Power

- Create a number or shape pattern (e.g., 2, 4, 6, 8... or square, circle, square, circle...).
- Explain the rule of your pattern (e.g., "Add 2 each time" or "Alternate shapes").
- Draw or write the first 10 terms of your pattern and describe it in 2-3 sentences.
